## CITY GETS METER CLEANER.



A huge electric blast blower that is capable of thoroughly cleaning and making old meters and similar clocklike devices look like new within 30 seconds or less is now being operated in the meter room of the city's water and electric department. The machine is entirely closed when being used, thus preventing any dust to escape other than through a chimney. C. E. Rhoades, a meter department employe, shown using the blower, handles the meter with rubber gloves which are attached to canvas sleeves. The blower, manufactured by the American Foundry Equipment company here, cost the city less than \$600. The old method of cleaning the meters by taking them apart and washing them in gasoline required about a half hour's work.
